EQUALITY & DIVERSITY

The Institute of Contemporary Music Performance (ICMP) is committed to developing an inclusive and supportive environment for students and staff where all are able to participate and where everyone has the opportunity to fulfil their potential. CAREERS AND EMPLOYABILITY

ICMP is committed to developing, maintaining and funding a comprehensive, effective and impartial programme of Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) which meets the individual needs of the students and alumni. The ICMP is a specialist music provider; our provision of CEIAG therefore, is tailored for that purpose and delivered through The Hub. The Hub is run by a team of music industry professionals and is dedicated to providing a practical, contextual and tailored careers service. The primary function of CEIAG provision at the ICMP is to provide all students and alumni with the support necessary to make the transition from the classroom to their chosen profession. All current full-time students have access to CEIAG as part of embedded learning, the VLE, arranged activities or via drop in or appointment times. In addition, ICMP alumni are able to access CEIAG through the VLE, arranged activities and via booking appointments with a member of The Hub.

CHARITABLE SUPPORT

ICMP focuses its charitable support around the Musicians Benevolent Fund, 'Music for All' (the charity of the Music Industries Association) and the International Guitar Foundation, whose activities include London centric concert and education programmes for young people.
